2017 Gillespie County Pecan Show

The Gillespie County Extension Office is pleased to announce the 2017 Gillespie County Pecan Show on Nov. 30, 2017. Entries are due on Nov. 29, 2017 at noon.

To enter, please bring to the Gillespie County Extension Office a brown paper bag of 40-42 pecans of the same variety that were grown by you. Seedlings, known hybrids and native pecans can be entered too, but will have their own categories respectively. Smallest pecan entries need to have at least a pound of pecan present.

What happens to your pecans during the show? Pecan show volunteers and extension agents will crack them. If entering, you are welcome to help us crack pecans on November 30th at 9 a.m., though it is not necessary to do so.

Your pecans will be judged based on weight, kernel size and shape, damage/disease presence and color. Pecans are categorized according to variety, so don't worry, your "Mahan" pecans aren't going to be judged against someone else's "Pawnee."

If your entries contain more than one variety of pecan, they will be disqualified. You can enter only one entry per variety, except for natives, seedlings and hybrids. Pecans that have been altered in any way, including but not limited to sanding, cut, or polished will be disqualified. Pecans must be from the 2017 crop.

Finalists from the county show will move on to the Central Texas Regional Pecan show on December 6th & 7th in Belton, Texas. Finalists from this competition will move onto the state competition in June 2018. The champions from the natives, classic/new and commercial divisions will be awarded trophies.

From 8-9 a.m. a special session on rangeland management will be led by Fred Reyna, a Rangeland Management Specialist with the NRCS.

Other session topics will include: hog control, herd health and a discussion panel of "Women Who Ranch."

Judging of turkeys will begin at 1 p.m. and will be followed by broilers.
At 6 p.m. the judging of Grand and Reserve Champions will start with Poultry first, followed by Swine, Lambs, Meat Goats and Steers.

Saturday, Jan. 13 at 11 a.m. will start with a pre-sale lunch for buyers and the 2018 Show will close with the auction starting at noon.

The class will be \$10 and can be paid at the door - No RSVP needed. For more information, please call the Extension office at 830-997-3452.






The Harper Community Livestock Show is scheduled for Saturday, Dec. 16.

Gillespie County Agriculture Commodity Association Membership Renewal

The primary objective is to control predators (coyotes, fox, bobcats and feral hogs) to protect domestic animals, desirable wildlife and birds, prevent damage to field crops, eliminate the outbreak of diseases associated with controlled predators and reduce pollution of the county's water resources.

Open to the public

The annual predator contest provides prize money partially matched by the Texas Sheep and Goat Raisers Assn. Commodity Board. The contest pays four places in each of four categories (coyote, bobcat, red fox and feral hog), \$500 for each category for a total of \$2,000. Names of those who take predators by legal means and enter those predators are drawn at the end of the contest period for prizes in the amount of: \$200, \$150, \$100, and \$50.

For members only

To be eligible to receive a bounty (\$125 for coyotes, \$25 for red fox and \$25 for bobcats), a GCACA spotter must be contacted to validate each animal taken. The validation form must be signed by the spotter and landowner or the landowners agent.

The validation form must be received by the GCACA treasurer in order to receive payment. Forms may also be presented to the Gillespie County Extension office to be forwarded to GCACA treasurer. No fetal specimens will be accepted. Maximum amount of bounties paid out on behalf of an individual landowner member is \$1,000.

Feral hog bounty

Funds have been allotted to pay \$5 per hog until the annual allotment is depleted. To receive the bounty, association members must present the tails, sealed in a sanitary and leakproof plastic bag, to the Agriculture Extension office at 95 Frederick Road in Fredericksburg. The minimum hog payout is 5 tails at a time with the date harvested and members property listed from which the hogs were legally harvested. No fetal specimens or pen raised feral hogs will be eligible. Maximum amount of bounties paid out on behalf of an individual landowner member is \$1,000.00.

Who can become a member?

Landowners in Gillespie County or anyone wanting to support the objectives of the Gillespie County Agricultural Commodity Association. Yearly dues are 15 cents per acre or a minimum of \$60.00, whichever is greater. To apply for membership, please come by the Extension Office and complete the membership form and pick up a packet.








Gardening By the Month: Winter Squash
